~ Commendation for corporate activities to build creative society through arts and culture ~

Association for Corporate Support of the Arts (President: Motoki Ozaki; 5-3-2 Shiba, Minatoku, Tokyo) announced that entry for Japan Mécénat Award 2014 is open. Any mécénat activity is entitled to entry when conducted during the period from April 1st 2013 to March 31st 2014 by a corporation or a corporate foundation.

It is not too much to say that corporate mécénat in Japan is cutting-edge in the world in terms of its quantity and quality. Corporations and corporate foundations have taken a lead prior to the government for supporting Japanese culture. Now, total amount of activity fee invested for corporate mécénat has reached to 81.1 billion Japanese yen, which is almost equivalent to the budget the government invests in cultural policies and projects. In such a large scale, corporations have made use of their experience, knowledge and network in order to practice their original activities. Needless to say, such activities highly enhance an important meaning of corporate mécénat within a society.

Japan Mécénat Award is to honor those respectful activities of corporations and corporate foundations that have significantly contributed to creation of a society. We also would like to have this award for introducing them towards diverse societies from home and abroad. Since 1991, the first year of Japan Mécénat Award, we have granted the awards to 179 activities from all over the country. In the last few years, concepts of award-winning activities associate with õmanufacturingö and õtown developmentö led by an association of small-to-middle-sized corporations, and õeducation for next generationö designed and developed in variety. Also, continuous cultural support for recovery of the affected regions and communities by the Great East Japan Earthquake is still active.

With our 24th Japan Mécénat Awards in 2014, we will continue to foster better understanding of the corporations and corporate foundations that put great efforts in building an abundant society. We now welcome entries from all over Japan. Entry can be made through the form on our website until May 30th. Award winners will be announced in the beginning of October 2014, and granted the awards and trophies at the ceremony of Japan Mécénat Awards held at Sprial Hall (Minato-ku, Tokyo) on November 21st, 2014.

Grand Mécénat Award

Offered to the most significant mécénat activity that has contributed to the promotion of arts and culture.

Mécénat Awards

Names of the awards will be chosen to reflect contents of winning activities. Offered to five winning activities which contributed to building a society through arts and culture.

Special Award: Award Granted by the Commissioner for Cultural Affairs

Offerd to a mécénat activity that has made significant contributions to enhance the cultural integration and creativity among the citizens, or to establish publicity of Japanese cultures in foreign countries.

Qualification Requirements

Mécénat activities that had been conducted in the period from April 1st 2013 to March 31st 2014, by corporations or corporate foundations that are based in Japan are eligible for entry. Applicants apply either directly or by recommendation.
